




Callery Pear




Special Clue: Has a large white flower.

Gingko




Special Clue: The fruit can smell bad.


Honey Locust




Hackberry






Special Clue: Fruit looks like spiky pompom.

Norway Maple




Pin Oak




Special Clue: Fruit is an acorn, which is collected by squirrels.

Red Maple




Special Clue: Fruit looks like wings.

Silver Linden




Sugar Maple


